

## ABSTRACT

### MEDIA AND THE PUBLIC: THE *NEW YORK TIMES* COVERAGE OF WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION FROM 2002 TO 2005 AND ITS CORRELATION WITH PUBLIC OPINION

Many criticize the media for biased reporting, especially since September 11, 2001, and the invasion of Iraq in 2003. This study takes a look at the *New York Times*' coverage of Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) from January 1, 2002, through December 31, 2005, and compares it to public opinion polls during that time period to determine that there is a correlation between the two.

In this study, a qualitative analysis of more than 1,900 of the *Times*' articles helps to show that as the number of editorials increased and the amount of hard news stories decreased, public opinion dropped. In the process of conducting a quantitative analysis, the study looked at six terms: axis of evil, Iraq, September 11, terror, weapon programs, and weapons of mass destruction. The quantitative study determined that there was a correlation between public opinion and the use of several of the terms, including Iraq,

terror, and Weapons of Mass Destruction. However, use of the other terms did not have a clear link.

In conclusion, the study found that the public's outcry over bias in the media is a credible argument. The use of public opinion poll information explains why the coverage of the *Times* could indeed affect the way the mass public thinks about this specific issue.

## Introduction

The United States entered Iraq in March 2003 with information that the state held weapons of mass destruction. While many citizens rallied around President George W. Bush after September 11, 2001, some were critical of the decision to go to war when not much evidence had been produced. From 2002 to 2005, the public began to realize the problems with the argument made by the U.S. government leading up to the war in Iraq.

This study analyzed the content of the *New York Times*' coverage of Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD). Then, the analysis was compared to public opinion polls to determine if there is a correlation between them.

The study looked at the *New York Times* because it is considered the "newspaper of record" in the United States. The newspaper is proclaimed as one of the most respected newspapers in the nation and is read by the elite public<sup>1</sup>. In addition, the newspaper is known for its in-depth coverage of international issues like WMD. The *Times* rarely uses wire services such as the Associated Press or Reuters.

<sup>1</sup> The elite public is a minority group that actively seeks the news and tries to make decisions based on the facts. This group is made up of public opinion leaders (major governmental and business leaders, well-known journalists, and reputable professors and professionals) who influence the opinions of the mass public. In addition, the attentive public is included in this group. The attentive public's views are not as widely disseminated as the opinion leaders' but they are informed on issues in the news and can act as the middle man for opinion leaders and the mass public.



Looking at the *Times*' coverage of WMD, the study analyzed articles from 2002 through 2005. This helped to show the change in the way the topic was covered. The study also helped make a comparison with public opinion polls.

This topic is important to research because so many people disapprove of the media. This can be seen in the letters to the editor featured in newspapers as well as on the Sunday morning political talk shows, where public opinion leaders mock the journalism community. In fact, many in the mass public claim the media often offer the bias of reporters rather than the facts of a story. The study reviews weapons of mass destruction because it was a relevant topic for the entire United States' population between 2002 and 2005. Also, the study looked at WMD coverage in the *New York Times* because it was thought that the significance of it would be easy to see the significance in the change of newspaper's coverage throughout the time period. This could assist later researchers in making conclusions about how coverage of other specific topics affects public opinion or even public policy.

## Literature Review

Weapons of Mass Destruction are not a new theme in the history of the United States' media. For some, it may come as a shock, but WMD have been a major threat to the United States for many years preceding the war in Iraq.

In her article, Moeller (2004) writes the media's portrayal of the threats imposed by WMD have changed drastically between 1998 and 2003. Her study covers three time periods – each one lasting about twenty days. Moeller (2004) explains why each time period is important to the evolution of WMD coverage by the media (Introduction, ¶ 5-7). However, she looks at all types of media, rather than specifically one news medium. Moeller's (2004) study breaks down several news media from the United States as well as two newspapers abroad (Introduction, ¶ 8). While this allows us to see the news coverage for three-week periods during and after three major world events<sup>2</sup>, it is important to look at a long period of time post-September 11 to see the changes in reporting about WMD. Also, it is interesting to look at one newspaper's differences in coverage between years because it shows how the major daily mass medium changed over time. Showing a correlation, or lack thereof, with public opinion will allow the reader to see how the single medium could have had an affect on how people view such a major national and world issue.

<sup>2</sup> Moeller looks at three events: 1. India's first nuclear weapons test, 2. the US justification for the war in Iraq, and 3. President George W. Bush's acclaimed end of the War in Iraq.

Media have a hard time defining the differences between the four various types of WMD: mass-casualty terrorism, military-sponsored chemical- or biological-weapons terrorism programs, small-scale chemical or biological terrorist attacks, and superterrorism.

Sprinzak (1998) and Moeller (2004) both write it is the fault of the media that people are not well educated on the kinds of WMD (Sprinzak ¶ 22 and Moeller, Major findings, ¶ 8). However, Sprinzak's (1998) explanation of this attributes this downfall specifically to sensationalist journalists. Moeller (2004) explains this has a major effect on the public; people misunderstand the level of each threat and there may be more coverage of the WMD themselves rather than how the United States can keep its people secure (General findings, ¶ 5).

Moeller (2004) also finds that the media, immediately following September 11, 2001, allowed the administration to set the agenda for getting information out to the public (General findings, ¶ 6-8). She explains how the media's lack of prioritization of WMD stories offered the public biased news reporting. Fried (2005) also finds that politics have a large influence over the media's coverage. She writes that politicians' speeches on the day of major events like September 11, 2002, or immediately following them, helped to encourage news magazine editors to unite major safety issues with Iraq (Fried, 2005). However, her research looked at two news magazines: *Time* and *Newsweek*. While these are well-respected news media, it is important to look at the possible role of a newspaper, as well.

Compton (2004) writes that media allowed the public to be deceived because they had a hidden motive – not because the Bush administration pushed them into it (Final Comments, ¶ 1). He claims the news media became collaborators of the President's administration rather than act as a supervisory power. Compton's (2004) study looked into the shock and awe of the media's coverage of the war in Iraq and the reasons for the invasion, such as WMD. However, his research is more geared toward a critical analysis of the media's coverage of the invasion of Iraq and how it came about. The different media are not compared quantitatively, which would give us a better understanding of how the media's coverage of WMD changed as the United States went into Iraq.

Levine (n.d.) explains more, rather than criticizes, in his article, the importance of media coverage. He places the responsibility of news interpretation partly on the public. Levine (n.d.) writes that it is not possible to look at the quality of media coverage of an issue like Iraq if the researcher does not define what the public should do with the information the media distribute. He refers to Moeller's (2004) research in the article and explains how her work can help one understand the laziness of journalistic practices. Levine (n.d.) also claims that in an attempt to entertain the masses, the news media tended to alter its criticism and investigation of the government.

## **Methodology**

This study looked at this newspaper's coverage of WMD from January 1, 2002 to December 31, 2005. By doing so, one can see the change in the *Times*' coverage of WMD and make observations about whether or not the medium included bias in its reporting during that time period.

To complete this analysis, back issues of the newspaper were found using the Internet. Since the actual newspapers from this time span were unavailable on campus, the study utilized Lexis Nexis, offered through the Sampson-Livermore library at UNC Pembroke. Also, the study used a ProQuest database for *New York Times*' articles offered through the Wake County Public Libraries website to find the small number of articles written by the Associated Press and Reuters. These articles were not listed on the Lexis Nexis database. While *Times*' website offered a list of articles in the archives that concerned WMD and Iraq, the full text of each article was unavailable to readers without paying a fee.

In order to study *The New York Times*' coverage of WMD, qualitative and quantitative content analyses were conducted. There will be four categories to classify each article for

the qualitative study: front page, news, editorial, and other sections<sup>3</sup>. The “other” category included articles from the review, sports, arts, weekend, and magazine sections.

The qualitative study required reading through 1,901 articles for content and writing notes. Pie charts were created for each year from 2002 to 2005 to show how the proportion of a certain type of article changed over time (see Appendix A, figures 1-4).

The study focused on the quantitative data from the articles as well. The study concentrated on six words or phrases that were thought to most incite emotion among the American public since September 11. Those terms included: axis of evil, Iraq, September 11, terror, weapon programs, and weapons of mass destruction. The study required all of the articles to be evaluated for the number of times each term appeared (see Appendix A, figures 5-10 and Appendix B). After making bar graphs of the quantitative data, the study shifted its focus to public opinion.

While it would have been ideal to have conducted interviews during the four-year span, this research began after 2005. So, it was viewed that public opinion polls would be the best way to show how the public felt on the issue of WMD in Iraq. The study received polling information from Polling the Nations, a survey database students have access to on the UNC Pembroke campus. The study had to use polling questions from Gallup Poll

<sup>3</sup> While some of these types of articles could overlap (i.e. a breaking news story could be featured on the front page), I referred to the news stories as those not on the front page. An editorial should only appear on the editorial page or the op-ed page.

and Harris Interactive. The use of more than one polling source came because no one source asked consistently the same question for the four years. The study focused on questions of whether the public believed there were WMD in Iraq before and at the time the U.S. invaded Iraq in 2003. From this information, correlations could be drawn between the analyses conducted and the polling information.

## Results

When looking at the data, one can determine there was a major media bias during the lead up to the invasion in Iraq. The qualitative analysis helped to determine that the medium tried to incite feeling in its readers. For example, an article on October 25, 2002 explained the consensus in the Arab world that Americans are not to be trusted. The writer described a sign held up at the Al Azhar Mosque by a young boy that said, "I love 11 September" (Wakin, 2002, ¶ 1). When reading this article, the American audience thinks back on the horrific day. Thus, the article could incite anger and sadness.

In addition, the Times' writers used colorful writing to provoke feeling from the public. While this is a usual practice in journalism, it seemed to be more than simply telling the news. One could almost say the colorful writing seemed like a book rather than the news. In an article on December 4, 2002, the writer uses colorful language to describe Iraqis opening up to United Nations inspectors (Burns, 2002). However, the fanciful language used in the piece helps readers to do more than see the inspection taking place. It opens up the opportunity to transmit the writer's opinion of the event.

Another major problem of the newspaper during this time was the integration of analysis by reporters. This many seem harmless; it is important for reporters to explain happenings, especially international issues because the audience cannot experience it first-hand. However, some elite journalists' opinions are widely respected and one writer's beliefs transferred through an analysis and the elite public could have major



effects on the thinking of the masses. Writers do not have the authority to analyze situations, on which they are not experts. Some of these articles even made it to the front page of the newspaper<sup>4</sup>. Too many reporters do not understand this concept and often combine their opinion with the facts of the story.

The *New York Times* eventually ran stories knocking editors for being too complacent with information given by the government leading up to the war in Iraq. In an article on March 22, 2003, the writers explained that while the majority of the public believed President Bush's claims that Iraq had WMD, critics blamed the media for not covering the story as accurately and objectively as possible (Rutenberg and Toner, 2003). By the time the article went to print, U.S. soldiers were already in Iraq. Still, the recognition of the media's flaw should have been a good indication to the newspaper to improve its watchdog skills. Instead, the *New York Times* continued to follow the lead of the government. Finally, in 2005, the *Times* apologized for its lack of objectivity throughout the invasion of Iraq.

In the first year of articles, news stories took up more than half of the coverage (see figure 1 of Appendix A). The proportion of news stories compared to the use of editorial

<sup>4</sup> The front page of the newspaper is the most read. An article in the upper right corner of the page is the most likely story to be read, so editors place the most important information there. This can be adjusted by the use of photos. Photos are looked at first, followed by headlines and photo captions. Most likely, readers will read through the lead of a story as well. Very rarely does a reader jump to an inside page, unless he or she is looking for something in particular. When a story alludes to the opposition only in the later part of a story and it is featured in a jump from page 1, there is a good chance the opponent's argument will not be read by many.

content dropped each year after that. One can see that the proportion of hard news stories gets smaller in 2003, but does not drop dramatically until 2004 (figure 4). Consequently, the proportion of editorials in the newspaper increased.

With the exception of a slight increase from 2002 to 2003, front page articles concerning WMD dropped drastically (figures 1 and 2). Yet the proportion of front page articles, compared to the other categories, stayed relatively the same throughout the four years.

The term axis of evil was used in 2002 during President Bush's State of the Union address. President Bush modeled the term after the "axis" (the enemy) in World War II. The term used in 2002 described Iraq, Iran, and North Korea as states trying to build WMD. After immediate coverage of President Bush's speech, the term was not used much, especially in subsequent years (figure 5).

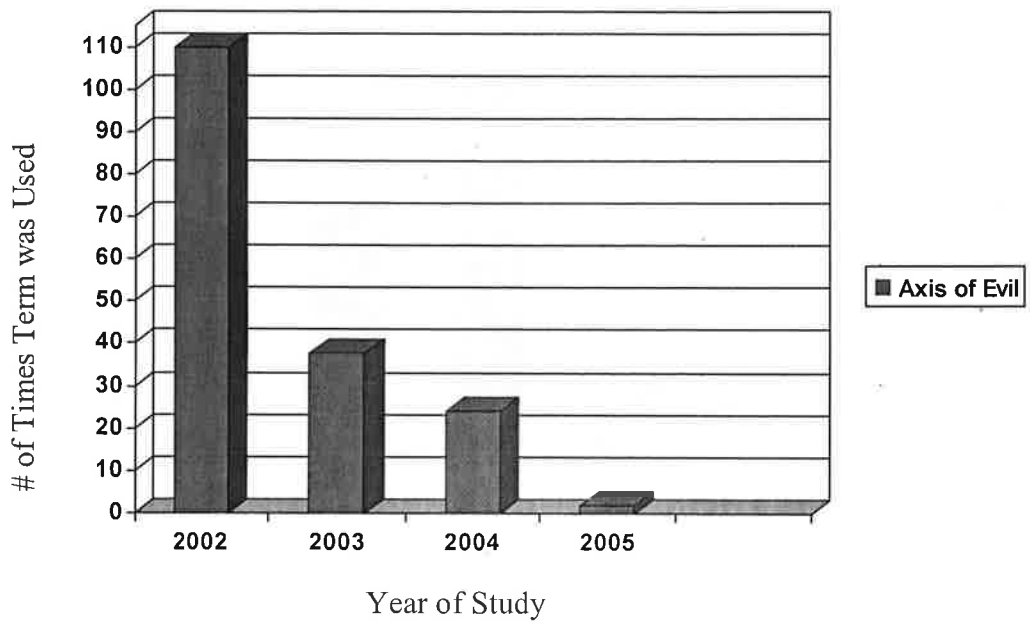


Figure 6: The Use of Iraq in the *Times*' Coverage

September 11 was still fresh in the minds of Americans in 2002, so the term was used frequently (figure 6). The use dropped in 2003 when the United States entered Iraq and then jumped again in 2004 when the number of editorials in the newspaper overtook the hard news content concerning WMD. By 2005, the term, much like the other five dropped off because the media were more focused on other topics.

When looking at public opinion polls, the study found that public opinion steadily dropped from 2002 to 2004 and leveled out in 2005. A Gallup Poll (2002) found that

fifty-five percent of those surveyed believed there were WMD in Iraq at the time and forty percent believed Iraq was in the process of weapon development. By July of the next year, those numbers had dropped when a Gallup Poll (2003a) determined that only twenty-two percent of people surveyed believed the United States would find any WMD in Iraq. However, two months earlier, a Gallup Poll (2003b) was conducted and seventy-nine percent of the population polled felt that the war in Iraq would be justified even if no WMD were found. Harris Interactive (2005) polled a group of people and found that half believed there were no WMD in Iraq when the United States invaded. The study also found a divide down party lines. In a poll of 1,000 people by CBS News (2003), eighty percent of those polled that believed that Iraq probably had WMD also said they were Republicans. Only thirteen percent said they were Republicans, but they believed there were no WMD in Iraq. The poll found that forty-nine percent of those polled said they were Democrats and they believed Iraq probably had WMD. Forty-six percent said they were Democrats and they did not think Iraq had weapons.

By comparing the qualitative analysis and public opinion, it can be determined that as the number of editorials increased in the newspaper, public opinion as to whether there were WMD in Iraq fell. One can say that this could be attributed to the increase in critical thinking involved in writing editorials. Also, many of the editorials printed in the *New York Times* are written by high-ranking officials. Margaret Thatcher, John Bolton, and Robert Gates were among the contributing public opinion leaders.

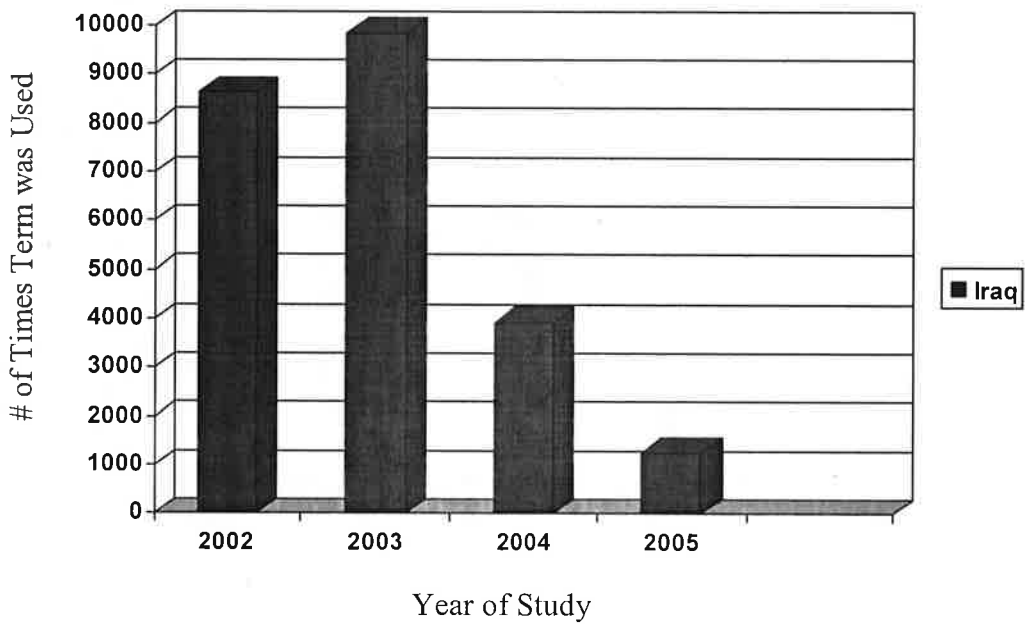


Figure 7: The Use of September 11 in the *Times*' Coverage

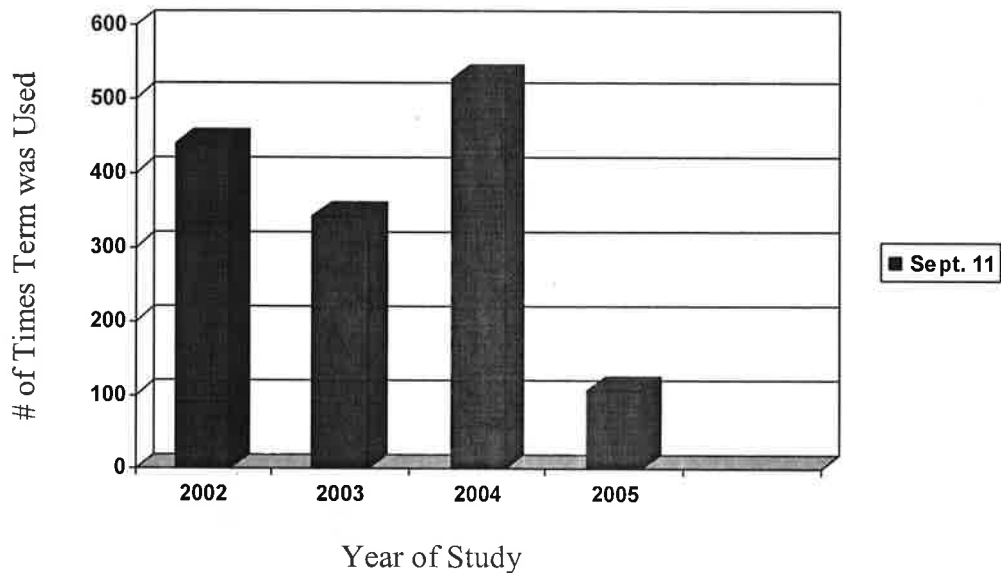


Figure 8: The Use of Terror in the *Times*' Coverage

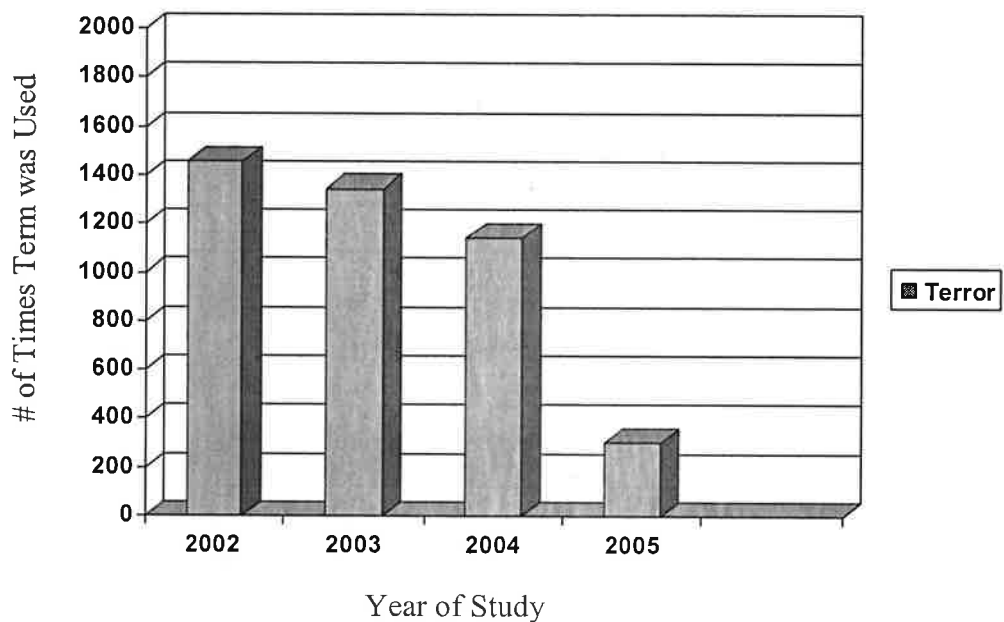


Figure 9: The Use of Weapon Programs in the *Times*' Coverage

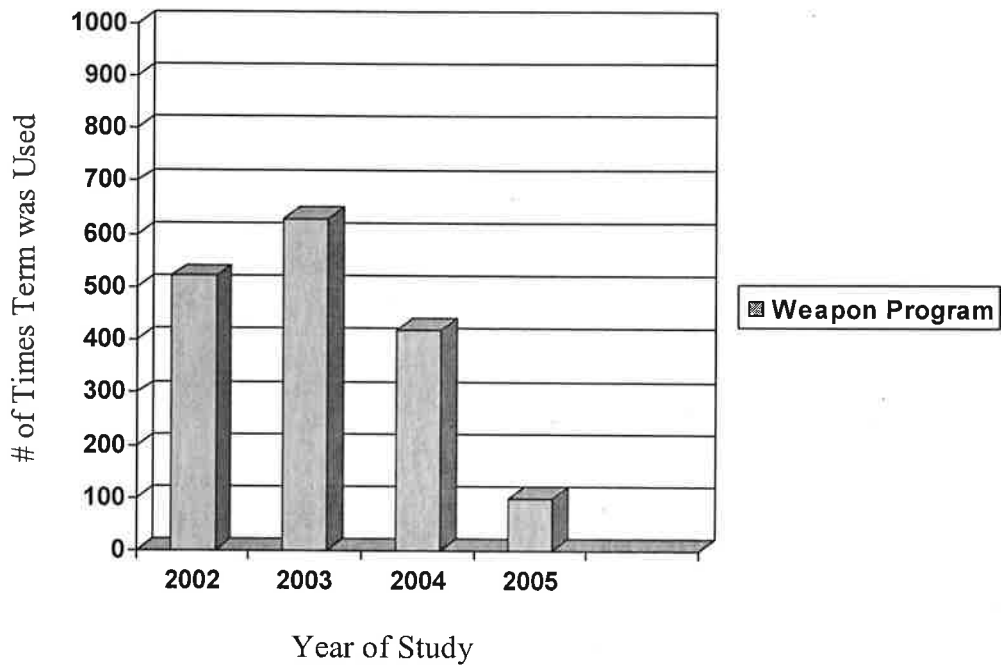
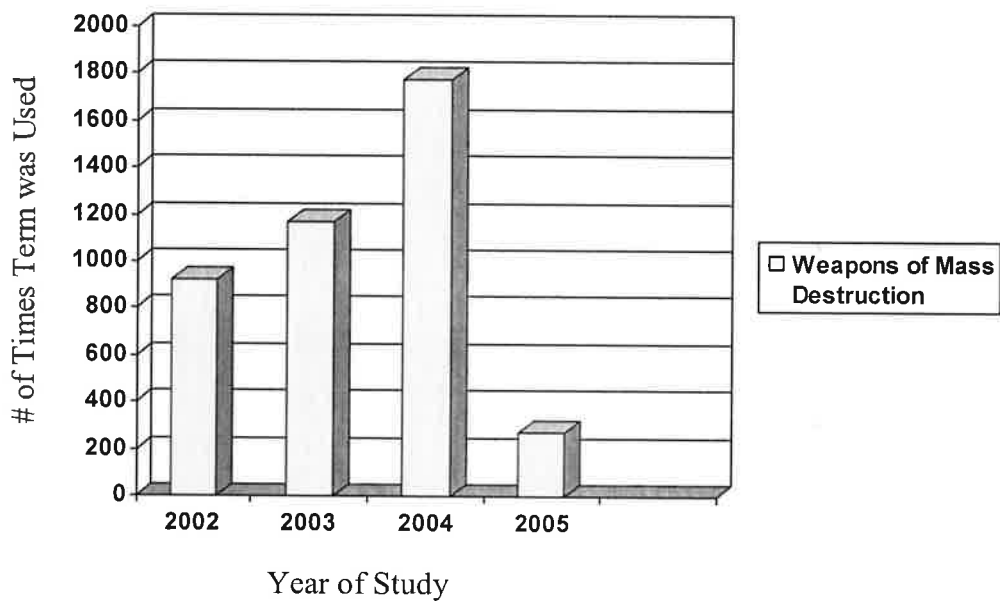


Figure 10: The Use of Weapons of Mass Destruction in the *Times*' Coverage

Looking at the quantitative analysis with the public opinion polls, one can find a positive relationship between the use of terror and the way the mass public felt about WMD in the state during the four-year span. The gradual decrease in the use of the term terror modeled the steady decrease in public opinion (figure 8). Also, the more WMD were mentioned in articles, the less likely the public thought they were hidden in Iraq. This is because, in part, the term was used so many times in editorials and letters to the editor (figure 10). The use of Iraq rose in 2003, much like public opinion right before and during the entrance into Iraq (figure 7). Then, the word was not used as much in 2004 and 2005. This resembles the pattern of hard news stories during the four years. Much like the use of Iraq, the use of weapon programs increased from 2002 to 2003 and dropped in 2004 and 2005 (figure 9).

## Conclusion

One can see that the government's spin helped sway the coverage of the *New York Times* during the U.S. occupation in Iraq. Instead of being the watchdog of the government, the medium chose to "rally around the flag"<sup>5</sup> by reporting what the government fed the media. Moreover, the government withholds information from the public. This can hinder the media's attempt to investigate. During times of war and crisis, like the lead up to invading Iraq, sources within the government are more likely to back the President's decision and, therefore, give less information to the media.

It is also imperative to remember that the media is a business. The attempt to be the first to a story can compromise the effectiveness of the fact checker's position. Not only did the time constraint hamper accurate reporting, but also the amount of information given to the public. The tight deadline during the invasion of Iraq in 2003 undoubtedly led to the shorter articles that year. Those articles were not given enough room to review the previous articles' facts. Past information would have given readers the chance to compare situations from day to day in Iraq, bettering their knowledge and helping them to make opinions based on fact and not the opinions of writers.

The *New York Times*' has a motto: "All the News that's Fit to Print." Editors of the newspaper have a responsibility to decide what information the public reads and,

<sup>5</sup> The "rally around the flag" effect means the mass public will look to its leader for strength in a time of disaster, such as immediately after 9/11. Oftentimes, the mass public will believe what the leader (the President, in our case) says because it needs direction.

therefore, about which topics the public thinks are important. This idea is known as agenda-setting. Bias in the *Times* could be attributed to agenda-setting. For example, if there were fewer articles concerning WMD in Iraq included in the newspaper during one year than articles on a domestic issue, most likely readers would be more concerned with the domestic issue than the state of Iraq. For this reason, domestic issues are usually more important to Americans than international topics. Most U.S. news media, including the *Times*, have the majority of their reporters within the United States to cover stories that affect Americans more directly than international affairs.

However, blame does not lie solely with the *Times*. The public overlooked what little criticism of the war in Iraq that did appear in the newspaper. The mass public also rallied around the flag during the invasion of Iraq, giving President Bush and his administration more flexibility to do as they pleased.

Also, one cannot forget the possibility of external influences. Only a correlation can be drawn between the coverage of the *Times* and public opinion because there are so many effects from outside sources. For example, family can mold a person's political views and thus change the way they see a specific topic like the possibility WMD in Iraq. A person that grew up in a household where predominantly the political ideology was liberal may have more criticism of a Republican president's reasoning to invade another state.

However, in this case, the *New York Times* is known for being somewhat leftist, and yet it allowed the government to affect its coverage of the lead up to entering Iraq. Other

influences could include education, religion, age, gender, and socioeconomic status, just to name a few.

There are several ways this study can be expanded for future research. It would be interesting to look at the coverage of WMD by more than one medium. This would give a better depiction of how the media could have affected public opinion. In addition, this study could lay groundwork to explain how this affects what people think about an issue like WMD and how public opinion might affect the agenda setting of a news medium. It is also important to look at this over a long time span. This will allow us to see how coverage of WMD increased and decreased over time and we can see how the government could have affected this.

Also, it would be interesting to further this study by looking at coverage of WMD in the *New York Times* leading up to and during the first Gulf War. The data could then be compared to this study to see how the coverage of WMD has developed over time.

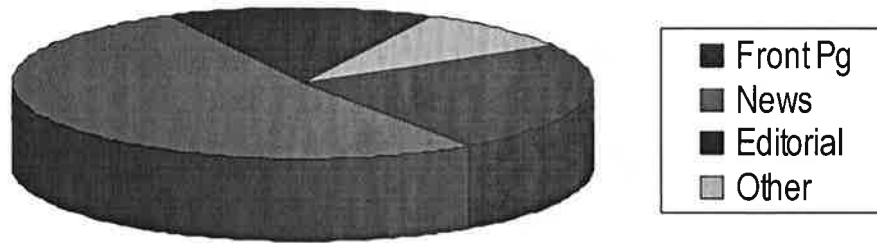

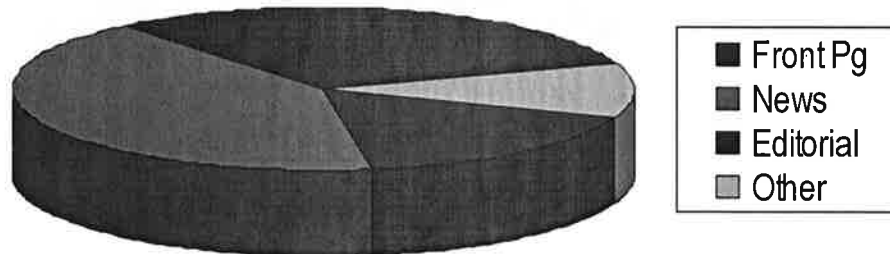

Figure 1: Article Type in 2002



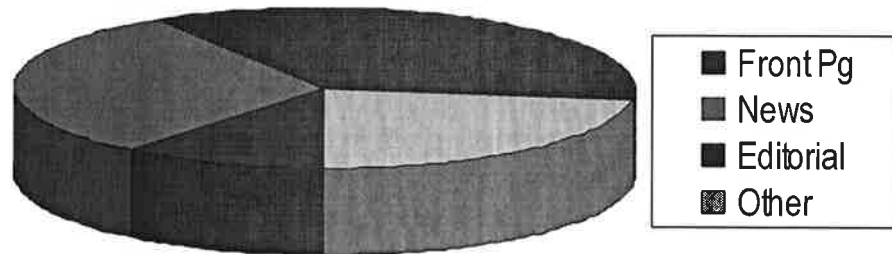

Figure 2: Article Type in 2003



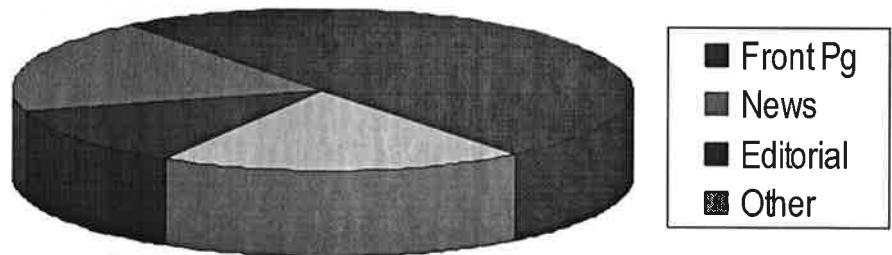

Figure 5: The Use of "Axis of Evil" in the *Times*' Coverage
